Children's rights activist Craig Kielburger will serve up the keynote at this year's Volunteer Breakfast in Kingston.

Kielburger first gained national attention when he co-founded Free the Children and Me To We. Free the Children is a not-for-profit that fights child labour practices around the world, from his suburban Toronto home at age 12. Today he's an MBA, entrepreneur, accomplished speaker and the author of a best-selling book on the power of volunteerism.

You can catch him live on Friday, April 19th, at 7 a.m. at the Rogers K-ROCK Centre as he helps kick off National Volunteer Week in KFL&A. Afterward, he'll share his message with high school students from both local school boards.


