





CELEBRATE VOLUNTEERISM



National Volunteer Week which takes place from April 12 to April 18 this year. During this weeklong celebration of volunteerism, registered charities, not-for-profit organizations and volunteer centres pause to thank and recognize their volunteers.

To help mark National Volunteer Week, the United Way Volunteer Centre is hosting a celebration on Tuesday, April 14, from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. in Memorial Hall, City Hall, 216 Ontario Street, Kingston. As part of the event, six recipients selected through a nomination process, will receive a "Volunteers Grow Community" award in recognition of their significant contribution to community through volunteerism.

Local agencies are invited to bring their volunteers to this free reception to celebrate volunteerism in our community. The awards and event are generously sponsored by Investors Group. Please register in advance at here.

As part of National Volunteer Week, the United Way Volunteer Centre is also hosting "Change the World," the Ontario Youth Volunteer Challenge. This initiative is made possible with funding support from the government of Ontario.

High school students can take up the challenge by committing to a volunteer activity between April 12 and May 24 and logging the hours they've volunteered. This year, the Volunteer Centre is targeting a goal of 2,500 youth volunteering for a total of 7,500 hours in KFL&A.

Students who are already engaged in volunteer activities can take part in the challenge by tracking their hours during the six week period and submitting them to their Student Services Department. Students who would like to participate but aren't affiliated with a volunteer activity can visit their Student Services Department for information on events in their school or contact the United Way Volunteer Centre to learn about available volunteer opportunities at www.unitedwaykfla.ca.
